

# Cookies and Camp 2010

hen Girl Scouts sell Girl Scout Cookies, they are also earning credit that can be used toward summer program fees. Each box sold represents a 20¢ credit to be applied for summer camp or destinations (40¢ for certain resident programs).

In the spirit of Girl Scout sisterhood, a girl may also choose to transfer her cookie credit to another Girl Scout. This is an individual girl-and-family decision, one that lets even more girls benefit from the opportunities of a summer experience. A girl may only receive transfers from one other Girl Scout, outside the family. She may also receive cookie credits from a sibling if she is not attending camp. A transfer form is in each girl's cookie packet and in the 2010 summer camp brochure. The form can be duplicated. The form must be received at GSRI by May 3<sup>rd</sup>. (Girls and their parents can fill the forms out as soon as the girls participate in the cookie sale. It's not necessary to know the exact amount of cookie credit to transfer it.)

All cookie credit supports Girl Scouting in our Council. Credit that isn't used for summer camp or destinations supports Girl Scout activities, equipment, and property maintenance. Thank you for caring and sharing – and for returning the transfer form by **May 3<sup>rd</sup>**

## **Please Note:**

**It is important that these are received at the council office in time to insure proper billing for camp!**

**It is not necessary to return the Cookie Credit Certificate that your child receives to use camp cookie credit.**

## **Please Also Note:**

**If your Daughter's Troop is taking the Older Girl Proceeds, rather than Incentives, your child will not be able to participate in the Cookie Credit Program.**
